Tahl and **Rodney Propp** founded TPE in 1997. Over the years they have developed partnerships with local agencies, and tenant and community organizations to enhance affordable housing advocacy efforts, as well as community initiatives for low to middle income families, and people with special needs. TPE presently owns, manages and is developing over 3,000 units of affordable housing in East and West Harlem.

"I thank P.A'.L.A.N.T.E. Harlem for this recognition, it's a true honor given its fierce advocacy and dedication to do the right thing for the people. I look forward to continuing to work with the organization to ensure that affordable housing remains a pillar of East and West Harlem for generations to come," Tahl said.
